WELDING CONCURRENT PROGRAM



The Career Studies Certificate (CSC) in welding prepares students for work as an apprentice welder. The Welding Program is accredited by the American Welding Society (AWS) Schools Excelling through National Skills Standards Education (SENSE) program. <u>This program is offered to a maximum of</u> <u>16 high school juniors and seniors.</u>

Program Qualifications:

- Students must meet JTCC minimum criteria to apply to the program.
- Students must be referred by their high school counseling department.
- Students must be able to attend classes at JTCC-Chester campus, Monday-Thursday, 8 a.m. to 10:05 a.m.

Program Costs:

- Payment of tuition, books & fees are determined and agreed upon by the school district and John Tyler.
- Students are required to purchase their own protective equipment.
- Most school districts cover the cost of transportation.

Program Credentials:

Students who complete the two-year program will receive a Welding CSC and 21 out of 30 credits needed toward a Welding Certificate. This prepares them for entry level positions as welders.



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
