On Tuesday, November 12, 2019, the member of the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) along with Mrs. Airon Grim, Mrs. Shanita Glaspie, and Mrs. Teresa Johnson, attended the Tri-Cities Region FBLA Fall Conference at Chesterfield Technical Center in Midlothian, Virginia. The guest speaker was Mr. Jonathan Miller Young, Director of Corporate Relations at the Reginald F. Lewis College of Business at Virginia State University (VSU) and a member of the

School Board in the City of Richmond. Regarding the latter, Mr. Young was elected to the Richmond School Board in November 2016, in a four way race. Mr. Young's responsibilities at VSU include initiating, cultivating, and strengthening relationships with industry for the purpose of business/ academic collaboration.

The students also had an opportunity to attend workshops. Listed below are the workshops and their presenters.

Mr. Peyton Anderson, Coordinator of Professional Learning, Chesterfield County Public Schools-#Lego4Scrum: Agility in business through transparency, inspection, and adaptation—This session gave the students an introductory glimpse into Agile work management by experiencing the process in building an entire town out of Lego bricks. The students were able to innovate, create, and grow as an individual and team member .

Ms. Megan Angstadt, Special Event Manager, ASK Childhood Cancer Foundation-**Project** ASK-Project ASK is a non-profit organization that strives to help make life better for children with cancer, in our central Virginia Community. Since 1982, the Virginia Chapters of the Future Business Leaders of America have supported ASK as a State Service Project. From the moment of diagnosis through treatment and beyond, ASK is there to provide emotional, financial, and educational support to families. Virginia State University Phi Beta Lambda Members-Team-building-This session provided the students with techniques to increase their team-building skills.
